At 9:01 A.M., the chairperson opened the public hearing authorizing the application to the Iowa Department of Economic Development for a Community Development Block Grant. Grundy County is considering submitting a Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) application for the Homebuyer Assistance Program as administered by the Iowa Economic Development Authority (IEDA). A total of \$121,325 will be requested, the application will be submitted on or before July 31, 2020, and all funds will be designated for low-and-moderate-income households. Any homebuyers displaced due to lead hazard remediation activities will be assisted with relocation services. If funded, the nature of the proposed activities includes providing up to 50% (not to exceed \$7,000) of the lender's required down payment, up to \$3,500 in closing cost assistance, and up to \$300 in property inspection fees. Total costs for these activities shall not exceed \$24,999. If warranted, lead hazard reduction activities will take place. Up to five households will be assisted through this single-family homebuyer activity. It is estimated that two of the five units will be new construction through the Homes for Iowa program. The Project Location consists of all areas within Grundy County limits that are completely outside the 1% annual chance ("100-year") floodplain, also known as the Special Flood Hazard Area. For the purposes of this project, the County will use the Federal Emergency Management Agency's (FEMA's) preliminary Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRMs) for Grundy County. Grundy County adopted a 2019 Housing Needs Assessment (HNA) on January 6, 2020, pursuant to Resolution #22-2019/2020. The HNA included several findings that indicated a need for new housing opportunities and resources within the community. The HNA reported that under current population projections, Grundy County will grow by an estimated 76 households by 2030. Considering population trends, housing inventory, demolition and attrition rates, the HNA projected a demand for an additional 62 owner-occupied units by 2030. While there is a need for new housing units, the HNA also reported that 80.6% of the total housing stock was built prior to 1980. Needs that come with an aging community housing stock include purchase-rehabilitation, repair, and ensuring that units are lead-safe for families. CDBG funds through the Homebuyer Assistance Program can help the community with these efforts.

There was no one present to speak in favor of or against the application, and the chairperson closed the hearing.

The Grundy County Board of Supervisors met in regular session in the courtroom at the Grundy County Courthouse on August 24, 2020, at 9:00 a.m. Chairperson

Smith called the meeting to order with the following members present: Bakker, Nederhoff, Ross, and Schildroth.

The Board opened the meeting by reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

Motion was made by Ross and seconded by Nederhoff to approve the minutes of the previous meeting. Carried unanimously.

At 9:01 a.m., the chairperson opened the public hearing regarding Amendment to Ordinance No. 2009-5. No one spoke in favor of the amendment. Darrell Sloth opposed the amendment as he believed it would create a precedent for other housing districts. He said that it would create congestion, dust, and noise from more houses in the area. John Oltman opposed the amendment as this area is a woodland and habitat for wildlife, including owls. He said that the proposed site is on a gravel road, has eight residences currently, is dusty, and could create a precedent that would get out of hand. Michael Thomas opposed the amendment as he believes that the land should remain agricultural. He said that there is no need for additional housing in a rural area and that housing developments do not belong on a gravel road and should only be allowed within one mile of a town. A telephone message from Frank Dargan and an email from Richard and MaeLynne Dean opposing the amendment were also read. The chairperson closed the hearing.

Motion was made by Schildroth and seconded by Bakker to accept the first reading of Ordinance #2021-1, an Ordinance amending Ordinance No. 2009-5. Supervisor Ross stated that he did not understand why those that are currently living in the area are opposed to having more residences built. Supervisor Smith stated that she is in favor of development, generally, but she does not believe that a subdivision on a gravel road should be encouraged. Supervisor Schildroth stated that previously he had voted twice to deny this amendment and that he had not heard anything today that would change his position. Roll call vote was as follows: Ayes – Ross. Nays – Bakker, Nederhoff, Schildroth, and Smith. Ordinance defeated.

Motion was made by Bakker and seconded by Schildroth to introduce Resolution #15-2020/2021 as follows: WHEREAS, the Grundy County Planning and Zoning Commission has recommended to the Grundy County Board of Supervisors that the County deny an application for rezoning of A-1 Agricultural property to R-2 Residential, for the purpose of creating a small residential subdivision consisting of four singlefamily residences on real estate located in Grundy County and legally described, towit: Beginning at the West Quarter corner of Section Twenty-two (22), Township Eighty-nine (89) North, Range Fifteen (15), West of the 5th P.M., thence South 89°27'50" East 540 feet along the north line of the Southwest Quarter (SW 1/4) of said section; thence South 0° 1050 feet; thence North 89°27'50" West 290 feet; thence North 0° 35 feet; thence North 89°27'50" West 250 feet to the West line of said Southwest Quarter (SW1/4); thence North 0° (assumed) 1015 feet to the point of beginning, and WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors considered the recommendation of the Grundy County Planning and Zoning Commission, and WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors believes it to be in the public interest and to the public benefit and welfare to deny the rezoning application. This Code of Conduct applies to all officers, employees, or agents of Grundy County, Iowa, engaged in the award or administration of contracts supported by federal grant funds. No officer, employee, or agent of Grundy County, Iowa, shall participate in the selection, award, or administration of a contract supported by federal grant funds, if a conflict of interest, real or apparent, would be involved. Such a conflict would arise when: a. The employee, officer, or agent; b. Any member of his/her immediate family; c. His/her partner; or d. An organization which employs, or is about to employ any of the above; or has a financial or other interest in the firm selected for award. Grundy County, Iowa, its officers, employees, or agents shall neither solicit nor accept gratuities, favors, or anything of monetary

value from contractors, potential contractors, or subcontractors. To the extent permitted by federal, state, or local laws or regulations, violation of these standards may cause penalties, sanctions, or other disciplinary actions to be taken against the County's officers, employees, or agents, or the contractors, potential contractors, subcontractors, or their agents. Persons who make expenditures to influence a HUD or EDA officer or employee in the award of financial assistance or taking of a management action by the department must keep records, and report to HUD or EDA on the expenditures; and 5. Persons who are retained to influence a HUD or EDA officer or employee in the award of financial assistance or in the taking of a management action by the department must register with HUD or EDA, and report to HUD or EDA on their lobbying activities. Motion was made by Ross and seconded by Nederhoff to introduce Resolution #18-2020/2021 as follows: WHEREAS, Grundy County has received federal funding through the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program; and, WHEREAS, Section 519 of the Department of Veteran Affairs and U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, and Independent Agencies Appropriations Act of 1990 requires that all CDBG recipients adopt and enforce a policy to prohibit the use of excessive force by law enforcement agencies within the recipient's jurisdiction against any individuals engaged in non-violent civil rights demonstrations; and WHEREAS, all recipients of CDBG funds are further required to follow a policy of enforcing applicable state and local laws against physically barring entrances or exits to a facility that is the subject of a nonviolent protest demonstration; and WHEREAS, Grundy County endorses a policy prohibiting the use of excessive force and will inform all law enforcement agencies within its jurisdiction of this policy. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, Grundy County hereby prohibits any law enforcement agency operating within its jurisdiction from using excessive force against any individuals engaged in nonviolent civil rights demonstrations. addition, Grundy County agrees to enforce any applicable state or local laws against physically barring entrances or exits from a facility or location that is the subject of a non-violent protest demonstration. Grundy County further pledges enforcement of this policy within its jurisdiction and encourages any individual or group who feels that Grundy County has not complied with this policy to file a complaint. Information and assistance relative to excessive force complaints shall be provided by the

The Chairperson, or their designee, has ultimate responsibility for the overall administration of the affirmative action/equal opportunity program. The total integration of equal opportunity into all parts of personnel and program management is the Chairperson, or their designee's, responsibility. The Chairperson, or their designee, will review all policies and procedures as they affect equal opportunity and affirmative action and ensure compliance with relevant federal and state statutes. The right of appeal and recourse is guaranteed by Grundy County, Iowa. The Board opened the meeting by reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

Motion was made by Bakker and seconded by Nederhoff to approve the minutes of the previous meeting. Carried unanimously.

At 9:01 a.m., the chairperson opened the public hearing regarding amendment to Ordinance No. 2009-5. Jacob Stauffer, representative from Overland Group, described the proposed Dollar General project and stated that the goal is to work together and invest in the community. Krista Grant, Conrad Chamber Main Street Director, stated that there is no known need for a retail store such as Dollar General and that the proposed location will draw shoppers away from the downtown area. Shane Tiernan, representing Conrad Development Corporation, stated that he hopes that the supervisors honor the recommendation of the Zoning Commission to deny this request and trust the judgment of business leaders in Conrad who are opposed to this request. He stated that Dollar General typically has a negative impact on communities and is a threat to current businesses, especially the grocery store which is critical as an anchor store in the community. He claimed that the project would lead to a net loss in jobs, a net loss in property taxes, would create a food desert in Conrad, and would compromise the ability to sell homes in the new development. Kurt Steckelberg, veterinarian, is concerned about traffic safety in the proposed location and suggested that a downtown location would be more suitable. Stauffer countered these arguments, stating that the purpose of zoning is not to pick winners and losers, that sales will bring business back to the community, that this is not spot zoning and zoning should not be used to extract higher prices from marginalized citizens, and that this is a suitable commercial site and there was nothing available to them within city limits. Supervisor Smith stated that she believes this is spot zoning, which should be avoided, and that she believes that the proposed Dollar General Store would have a negative impact on current downtown businesses and foot traffic in those businesses. She does not believe that Dollar General is a good community partner and that the negative impact of such a store is greater in smaller communities. Supervisor Ross said that while he had received no telephone calls that were supportive of the proposed zoning request, he continued to struggle with denying the request. The chairperson closed the hearing.

Motion was made by Schildroth and seconded by Nederhoff to uphold the decision of the Zoning Commission to deny the request for the rezone of the property for a Dollar General Store. Smith requested a roll call vote. Ayes – Bakker, Nederhoff, Ross, Schildroth, and Smith. Carried 5-0.
