







# GENERAL ELECTION NOTICE

## NOVEMBER 5, 2024

Notice is hereby given to the qualified electors of Grundy County that there will be a General Election in the County of Grundy, State of Iowa, on Tuesday, November 5, 2024, for the purpose of electing candidates for Federal, State, County and School offices and, on the back side of the ballot, for the retention of Judges, and Public Measures for two State Constitutional Amendments and School General Obligation Bonds. The polls will open at 7:00 a.m. and will close at 8:00 p.m. **Voters are hereby notified that Precinct 4 has been relocated for this election. Voters in Precinct 4, your polling place has been changed to the Holland City Hall at 111 Main St., Holland.** The polling places are as follows:

A public test of the vote tabulating equipment will be conducted at the Grundy County Annex beginning on November 1, 2024, at 9:00 a.m., and continuing until completion of the required test.

Grundy County residents who are not registered to vote are encouraged to do so. Residents may register in the office of the County Auditor in person, may obtain a registration form online at [www.grundycountyiowa.gov](http://www.grundycountyiowa.gov), may request that a registration form be mailed to them, or may register online at [www.sos.ia.gov](http://www.sos.ia.gov). The deadline to pre-register to vote for this election is October 21, 2024. With appropriate identification, an eligible elector may also register to vote on election day in the precinct where the person lives.

Pre-registered voters are required to provide an approved form of identification at the polling place before receiving and casting a regular ballot. Voters who are not pre-registered – such as voters registering to vote on election day – and voters changing precincts must also provide proof of residence. A voter who is unable to provide an approved form of identification (or prove residence if required) 1) may have the voter's identity/residence attested to by another registered voter in the precinct, 2) prove identity and residence using Election Day Registration documents, or 3) cast a provisional ballot and provide proof of identity/residence at the county auditor's office by 12:00 noon November 12, 2024. Election Day Registrant attestors must provide an approved form of identification. **Voter Accessibility:** All voting sites are fully accessible to persons with physical disabilities. Each site also has a voter assist ballot marking device that allows persons with disabilities to vote independently. This device allows voters to make their selections using an audio read-back and touchpad, or touchscreen. The touchscreen option provides magnification and reverse black and white images. Voters unable to see the screen may have the screen turned off and use only the audio read-back and touchpad features. The audio read-back feature provides all ballot instructions, choices, and selections in an audio format using headphones. After making selections with the ballot marking device, via touchpad or touchscreen, the device will mark the voter's paper ballot, and the voter will insert their marked ballot in the regular ballot tabulator used for all other ballots.

Voters may also choose another person to assist them to vote, except their employer, employer's agent, or an officer or agent of the voter's union.

Any voter who is physically unable to enter a polling place has the right to vote in the voter's vehicle. **PUBLIC MEASURES**

Shall the following amendment to the Constitution be adopted? 1

**Summary:** Provides for only U.S. citizens aged 18 or older and meeting state and county residency requirements to vote in all elections.

Further provides that 17-year-olds who will be 18 years old by the General Election are eligible to vote in the primary election, subject to the same citizenship and residency requirements.

Full Text: Section 1 of Article II of the Constitution of the State of Iowa, as amended by the amendment of 1970, is repealed and the following adopted in lieu thereof: Section 1. Electors. Only a citizen of the United States of the age of eighteen years, who shall have been a resident of this state for such period of time as shall be provided by law and of the county in which the citizen claims the citizen's vote for such period of time as shall be provided by law, shall be entitled to vote at all elections which are authorized by law. However, for purposes of a primary election, a United States citizen must be at least eighteen years of age as of the next general election following the primary election. The required periods of residence shall not exceed six months in this state and sixty days in the county.

Shall the following amendment to the Constitution be adopted? 2

**Summary:** Provides that the lieutenant governor will act as the governor if there is a temporary disability of the governor. Further provides that the lieutenant governor or lieutenant governor-elect will be the governor or governor-elect in the case of the resignation, death, or permanent disability of the governor or governor-elect thus creating a vacancy in the office of lieutenant governor or lieutenant governor-elect, as appropriate.

Full Text: Section 17 of Article IV of the Constitution of the State of Iowa is repealed and the following adopted in lieu thereof: Sec. 17. Lieutenant governor or lieutenant governor-elect to become or act as governor or governor-elect. If there is a temporary disability of the governor, the lieutenant governor shall act as governor until the disability is removed, or the governor dies, resigns, or is removed from office. In case of the death, resignation, or removal from office of the governor, the lieutenant governor shall become governor for the remainder of the term, which shall create a vacancy in the office of lieutenant governor. This section shall also apply, as appropriate, to the governor-elect and the lieutenant governor-elect.

**APLINGTON-PARKERSBURG COMMUNITY SCHOOL DISTRICT  
PUBLIC MEASURE CQ**

Shall the Board of Directors of the Aplington-Parkersburg Community School District in the Counties of Butler and Grundy, State of Iowa, be authorized to contract indebtedness and issue General Obligation Bonds in an amount not to exceed \$16,500,000 to provide funds to remodel, repair, improve, furnish, and equip the Aplington building into a grades PreK-6 building and to construct, build, furnish, and equip an addition to and remodel, repair, improve, furnish, and equip the Parkersburg building into a grade 7-12 building?

**GLADBROOK-REINBECK COMMUNITY SCHOOL DISTRICT  
PUBLIC MEASURE TV**

Shall the Board of Directors of the Gladbrook-Reinbeck Community School District in the Counties of Tama, Black Hawk, Grundy, and Marshall, State of Iowa, be authorized to contract indebtedness and issue General Obligation Bonds in an amount not to exceed \$16,500,000 to provide funds to build, furnish, and equip a classroom addition to its secondary school, with related remodeling and improvements, and site improvements?
